

REGION 17

HIGH POINT PROGRAM

The Region 17 High Point has been developed to recognize and encourage the continued participation of members of Region 17 at our horse shows.

Divisions

High Point Western Pleasure
High Point English/Country English Pleasure
High Point Hunter Pleasure
High Point Sport Horse
High Point Halter (main ring)
High Point Adult Amateur
High Point Junior

1. A Champion and a Reserve Champion will be awarded in each division. Prizes will be awarded to the winners.
2. Points will be calculated from January 1 to November 30. Show records for horses **and** riders must be submitted from the Arabian Horse Association Web site. Class placings/calculations to be submitted on the entry form on the Region 17 web site. One entry form per category. (ex. One for the horse and a separate one for the rider) A horse may be eligible for more than one division – ex: English Pleasure and Halter or Hunter Pleasure and Sport Horse but they can't be combined for one division. The records must be **RECEIVED** by December 31 of the current year (not post marked).
3. Presentations will be made at the Spring Regional Meeting. Winners will be notified and will be encouraged to attend.
4. AHA shows in Region 17 are to count. This includes Class A Region 17 shows, Western Canadian Breeders and Canadian Nationals. It will also include qualifying shows hosted by a Region 17 club as long as the show is held in Region 17 (ex: Region 5 qualifier). It will NOT include a different Region's offsite Regional show that is held in Region 17.
5. **The Region 17 Championship Show is a MANDATORY show to attend in order to be eligible for the Region 17 High Point awards.** If you do not show at the Region 17 Championships, you are not eligible for the High Point awards. (Approved at the 2011 Region 17 Fall meeting by the delegates)
6. High Point participant must be a member of a Region 17 Club, and a resident of Region 17.
7. The High Point Performance and Halter points will be calculated from all horse classes. (Equitation and halter showmanship not to count)

8. The High Point Adult Amateurs and High Point Juniors will be calculated with 1 Rider/Handler & 1 Horse combinations. Open, Amateur, Junior, Equitation, Showmanship and Halter classes to count. More than 1 combination may submitted by the owner or rider. Rider/Handler does not need to be the owner of the horse.
9. All exhibitors entering Region 17 High Point are assumed to have knowledge and understanding of the above rules and point system.

POINT SYSTEM

Class A Shows

Regular Classes

1 point for every horse that you beat. Include yourself in the point count. Points calculated up to 6 placings.

Championship Classes

2 points for every horse you beat. Include yourself in the point count. Points calculated up to 6 placings.

Western Canadian Breeders

4 points for every horse that you beat. Include yourself in the point count. Points calculated for the Top 6 horses at Western Canadian Breeders by placing. (ex. Champion, Reserve, Top 3, Top 4, Top 5, Top 6)

Region 17 Championship Show

6 points for every horse you beat. Include yourself in the point count. Points counted for the Top 5 horses at Region 17 by placing (ex. Champion, Reserve, Top 3, Top 4, Top 5).

Canadian Nationals

12 points for Champion, 10 points for Reserve Champion and 8 points calculated for the balance of the Top 10 as unranked. Include points for yourself starting with the 3rd placing.
